Bethel Church Council Minutes

December 12, 2011

Pastor's Report – Pastor Mike's written report was approved as presented. In addition to preparing for church services, he has taught a Sunday school class and the confirmation class, finished the Bible study course, provided counseling services, and made visits. He reported that Sunday school attendance has increased.

Youth Pastor's Report – Pastor Shayne reported that the youth collected a large box of canned goods and is currently collecting hats and mittens for the North Knox Social Ministries. The Junior and Senior High youth will be participating in a progressive dinner for their Christmas party and will also be decorating doors at the Freelandville Community Home. Youth Sunday is scheduled for January, and an after-school program for fourth and fifth graders is scheduled to begin January. In February the Junior High youth will be attending a conference; the Senior High youth's conference will be in March. Pastor Shayne expressed frustration that his youth programs are in constant competition with the school's sports programs.

Secretary's Report – The secretary's report was approved as written.

Treasurer's Report – One correction was noted on page five of the written report. The amount in the M. L. Mables account should have read \$445,037.05. The council approved the following dispersals from the Ministry Fund: \$500 from the Emergency Disaster Fund to a recent fire victim and \$3,400 to the Freelandville Community Home, funds collected during a recent fund drive by the Mission Committee.

Deacon's Report – The report was approved as written. The average attendance for November was 169, and the income for November was: offering, \$14,850.57; Atlas Gas, \$479.45; facility use, \$85; Rural King, \$28.74; interest income, \$85.64;

preschool, \$4048.18; FCH collection, \$2,517; mission fund, \$555; youth pastor, \$150; Mabes fund, \$2,000 (transferred for the final Anthis Heating & Air-Conditioning); and cemetery fund, \$100.

Elder's Report – It was shared that the Faithful Footprints SS Class would like relocate upstairs from the social room, which will take place as soon as a space becomes available. Pew communion will be celebrated on January 1, Epiphany Sunday.

Building and Grounds – It was reported that the required electrical work due to the installation of the new heating and air-conditioning system us nearing completion. Wolfe Construction is working on the leak problem around the tower and feels they will be able to correct the situation. Kevin shared information on the settlement progress with the insurance company concerning the storm damage last spring. Kevin will investigate other possible insurance companies and report his findings at the next meeting.

Old Business – There was no report on the purchase of the big screen and computer system for the sanctuary.

New Business – Ed shared that there are problems with the sound system and the assisted hearing devices. Also, some monitors are not working. Hopefully these can be corrected when the new computer system is installed. The need for a new TV and DVD player in the social room and a DVD player for the portable TV cart was discussed. It was decided to ask the special gifts committee to get quotes and make a recommendation at the next council meeting. The council reviewed committee assignments for 2012; board members will contact prospective new committee members.
